## TOURING SULLIVAN COUNTY'S MUSEUM . . . while dusting

An update for the museum is that a gracious benefactor has supplied us with the missing 1974 Bow Hunter's patch which has been sewn into its place on the encased quilt. That means that there are 49 patches on the display quilt with 7 openings left. Begun in 1957, the Bow Festival started the patches in 1971. We have, at the museum, the "First Thirty Years" of the Pennsylvania Bowhunters Festival printed in 1987 for sale for \$2.00 each.

Another sale item is the bricks for our Memorial Brick Sidewalk entering the main building from Muncy Street. This is a handicapped entrance and therefore wheelchair accessible. The bricks are \$50 each for 3 lines (14 characters, including spaces, per line). Orders placed at this time of year cannot be made or installed until spring ground thaw. There are approx. 175 bricks in place at this time, with a much greater capacity available.

Other items for sale at the museum are Wilderness to Wilderness by Wayne Bender (the story of Celestia), Historic Hodge Podge, Sullivan County Industries, Letters From Elizabethtown by Howard Peterman on reminiscings, Headwaters & Hardwoods, Images of Sullivan County, Folklore, Sullivan County Cemetery locations, The Satterfield Flyer by Doc Shoemaker, Laporte by Judy Mathe Foley, and maps galore. The amount of history within YOUR museum, whether saleable publications or compilings available to be searched through; can broaden your understanding of the formation of Sullivan County, PA.
