The park was also the receiver of the benefits of the CCC boys during the Great Depression. But this talk will dwell mainly on the efforts of the park from its inception to now, that it may remain in keeping with conserving and preserving the history of the land.

Bill Kocher will speak on behalf of the park and Cory Richmond from the Sullivan County Conservation District will be the speakers. Both men are well versed in the history of efforts to not only keep the park safe and presentable for visitors but also to maintain the goals that created the park in the first place. This event is free and open to the public.

Also, just to remind you, we're officially open for the summer on Thursdays, Fridays and Saturdays from 1 to 5 p.m. Should it be the case that on any of these days, you come and we're not open – it will be because we do not have a volunteer that day.
